

## Summer of Justice 2000 Job Description

### Position: Road Volunteer

#### Duties:

Members of Washington State's Access to Justice Network who serve as Road Volunteers for Summer of Justice 2000 have an unparalleled opportunity to take the Access to Justice message to the road and meet with people around the state and talk about "equal justice for all."

Volunteers are sought to participate in a 1 - 4 day segment of the summer-long road trip. Each segment will take place in a different community around the state. Volunteers will travel in a donated van with an EJC staff person to a community and participate in a variety of events that have been organized by the EJC and people in the communities to be visited.

Typical activities in which a volunteer might participate include (but aren't limited to):

- Attending an editorial board meeting at a local newspaper
- Attending a bar association picnic
- Facilitating a candidate's forum
- Meeting with a legislator and community members to talk about access to justice
- Staffing an Ask-A-Lawyer booth at a mall or a county fair — either providing brief legal advice or answering questions and having conversations about access to justice.
- Talking with private bar members, the general public, and representatives of nonprofit organizations about the importance of access to justice.
- Attending fundraisers, open houses, community meetings, etc.
- Soliciting signatures for legislative postcards

Volunteers will receive ample training including talking points and an explanation of the overall goals of Summer of Justice. Modest lodging, meals, and expenses related to the campaign (such as gas) are all covered. Incidental expenses, e.g., coffee, snacks, personal items, etc. are the responsibility of each volunteer. If the volunteer and the staff are unable to coordinate travel with the planned route of the van, the volunteer will be responsible for making his or her own transportation arrangements.

#### Qualifications:

- Support for the Access to Justice Network and civil equal justice in Washington state.

- Flexibility: this is a road trip. Plans can change, events can be cancelled or added at the last minute, tires can go flat, meals can be lousy.
- A sense of humor will be helpful
- Willingness to make a reasonably certain time commitment before signing up for a segment of the trip.
- An ability to not just tolerate but to relate well to a broad range of people—judges, politicians, community members, etc.

Suggested Qualifications:

- A reasonably good driving record. While an umbrella insurance policy will be purchased to cover anything that could possibly go wrong, for our own peace of mind we hope that your record does not reflect any Road Warrior-type tendencies.
- Tolerance for hot greasy food
- Ability to multi-task (i.e., eat hot greasy food while driving)
